

Spring Lake Township Adopt A Road Program

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Community groups, churches, individuals, families or businesses adopt a road by committing to pick up litter on both sides of a road.

ADOPT A ROAD GROUPS AGREE TO:

A minimum commitment of three years

Select a segment of road and pick up litter on both sides of the roadway. Clean up is done twice a year, in the Spring and Fall.

Appoint a group representative who will be responsible for coordinating your group clean up dates and serve as a contact to the Township.

Sign a waiver holding the Township harmless for any injury sustained during clean up event.

Report in with Spring Lake Township staff after every pickup to confirm your volunteer assignment has been completed.

SPRING LAKE TOWNSHIP WILL:

Provide safety vests, trash bags and bag disposal.

Place a sign on the road segment with the name of your group in recognition of your group's efforts. The name on the sign shall be limited to two lines of eighteen characters (including spaces). The Township reserves the right to approve and/or edit names or acronyms. No logos, website addresses, political candidates/titles, or telephone numbers are allowed on the signs.

WHAT ELSE SHOULD I KNOW?

Spring Lake Township will help your group select a road to adopt, if needed.

All participants must review and abide by the safety rules.

Participants must be at least 12 years of age, and anyone under 18 must have adult supervision.

Groups should leave filled trash bags along the roadside.

If large items such as mattresses or appliances are found, please notify the township- DO NOT REMOVE

When clean-up is complete, contact ROAD OVERSEER at 612-790-0649 to arrange bag pick up.
